About Hinamatsuri (doll festival)

The Doll Festival, one of five seasonal festivals, celebrates the happiness and growth of girls. It is said that the custom of Nagashi Hina (floating dolls), in which impurities are transferred to paper dolls and floated down a river during the Heian period (794-1185), and the doll game Hiina were combined, and the gorgeous dolls we see today were not displayed until the middle of the Edo period (1603-1868). In Okinawa, there is an event called "Hamagori (going down to the beach)" on March 3rd, where people go to the beach, step on the white sand, and celebrate by getting rid of evil spirits with sea water. This year it will be held on Saturday, April 22nd.
